New UN iPhone App

A new UN iPhone application (called: UNEP carbon calculator) highlights the role of ecosystems in tackling climate change. Users of the application can calculate their personal carbon footprint for journeys taken by air, train, or road. They will then be shown the equivalent area of a particular ecosystem (such as a tropical forest) that can store this amount of carbon dioxide. Sustainable Consumption in the Movies

The Center for a New American Dream has released a new video entitled [The High Price of Materialism](#). In this short animation, psychologist Tim Kasser discusses how America's culture of consumerism undermines our well-being. When people buy into the ever-present marketing messages that "the good life" is "the goods life," they not only use up Earth's limited resources, but they are less happy and less inclined toward helping others. The video both lays out the problems of excess materialism and points toward solutions that promise a healthier, more just, and more sustainable life.

Fellowships in Sustainability

The **Sustainability Science Program** at Harvard University invites applications for resident fellowships in sustainability science for the academic year beginning in September 2012. The fellowship competition is open to advanced doctoral and post-doctoral students, and to mid-career professionals engaged in research or practice to facilitate the design, implementation, and evaluation of effective interventions that promote sustainable development. Each summer, the **International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis** (IIASA), located in Schloss Laxenburg near Vienna, Austria, hosts a selected group of graduate students, primarily doctoral, from around the world in its Young Scientists Summer Program (YSSP). These students work closely with an IIASA senior scientist mentor on a

project proposed by the student, related to his or her graduate research. For students selected to participate, funding is available for travel and living support, principally from IIASA's sixteen National Member Organizations (NMOs). The United States NMO funds both American citizens and non-citizens who are studying in the country. The deadline for applications is **January 16, 2012**. Industry Canada Partners with Business School to Establish Sustainability Council

Industry Canada (IC) has commissioned the Network for Business Sustainability (NBS) at the Ivey School of Business (University of Western Ontario) to establish an Industry Association Sustainability Leadership Council. IC and NBS are currently reaching out to industry associations across Canada to advise them of this unique undertaking and the first meeting of the Council in Toronto at the end of February.

The purpose of the Council is to bring together senior leaders of industry associations to identify sustainability challenges facing industry associations and their members, to share best practices, knowledge and education, and identify gaps for further research and knowledge dissemination. The Council will be able to leverage NBS best practice knowledge (briefings and webinars), participate in custom projects and facilitated dialogues, and link up with leading academics all with a view to moving closer to a shared agenda and vision for sustainability in Canada. Special Issues Seeking Content

Academic editorial contributors are being sought to contribute to a new reference work about biomes and ecosystems to be published by Salem Press in 2013. With approximately 600 articles in four volumes, **Biomes and Ecosystems: An Encyclopedia** is a comprehensive review of key biological and geographic classifications tied to the high-school and college curriculum. New article assignments are currently in the works, with a final deadline of **January 13, 2012**. Each article ranges from 600 to 3500 words and is signed by the contributor. The General Editor for the encyclopedia is Dr. Robert Warren Howarth, Cornell University, who will review all the articles for editorial content and academic consistency.

The report presents three country case studies that look at the current institutional frameworks and governmental capacities for implementing effective ESC from China, Japan, and Republic of Korea. Despite diverse policy dialogues and many initiatives on SCP, there is still a lack of knowledge and experience on how we actually can educate nations and their citizens for sustainable consumption.

The main focus of the recommendations is on improving the wider policy and institutional frameworks for ESC implementation and to discuss how ESC can be better linked with wider policies for both sustainable production and consumption (SCP) and education for sustainable development (ESD).
