International Workshop on Grassroots Innovations for Sustainability

"Community food projects are not about food, and community energy projects are not about energy" was one of the conclusions from an international workshop of experts on 'grassroots innovations'. The three-day workshop was organised by Dr Gill Seyfang (a senior lecturer in sustainable consumption, at 3S, UEA) and Dr Adrian Smith (a senior researcher in innovation and policy studies at SPRU, Sussex) from May 16-18th, 2012, and held at the University of Sussex.

It drew together experts in grassroots innovations to discuss their work studying community-based solutions for sustainable development across a range of sectors including food, energy, housing, finance, governance and consumption. These included community gardens, local currencies, eco-housing projects, community-owned renewable energy, low-carbon lifestyles, community-supported agriculture schemes and local carsharing projects. This growing list of grassroots innovations all share the fact that they involve networks of activists and organisations generating novel bottom-up solutions for sustainable development; solutions that respond to the local situation and the knowledge, interests and values of the communities involved.

A key finding from the workshop was how vulnerable such initiatives are, being dependent on grant funding and volunteers, and needing support in terms of funding, information and expert advice. "Another challenge for these types of projects relates to how firmly rooted they are in local contexts, and rely on very specific types of people, skills and resources", commented Adrian Smith, "This rootedness is what makes these projects successful, but it also presents challenges when it comes to replicating the ideas elsewhere. UNEP: "Humanity Can and Must Do More With Less"

A recent report from UNEP's International Resource Panel, (the fourth in a series) warns that given the Earth's finite resources potential higher levels of resource consumption are "far beyond what is likely sustainable." The report, "Decoupling Natural Resource Use and Environmental Impacts from Economic Growth" calls for improving the rate of resource productivity and at least freezing per capita consumption in wealthy countries.

"People believe environmental 'bads' are the price we must pay for economic 'goods.' However, we cannot, and need not, continue to act as if this trade-off is inevitable," UN Under Secretary-General Achim Steiner, UNEP's Executive Director says. "Decoupling is part of a transition to a low carbon, resource efficient Green Economy needed in order to stimulate growth, generate decent kinds of employment and eradicate poverty in a way that keeps humanity's footprint within planetary boundaries."

Festival of Transitions next week!

The future is hard to predict but one way or another our economy and society will change dramatically as we adapt to the end of cheap fossil fuels, address the threat of runaway climate change and fix our broken financial system. A new, positive approach to this transition is emerging which sees it as an opportunity to change all of our lives for the better.

The Festival of Transition is a series of events, talks, and walks up and down the country culminating in a nationwide day of action and reimagining on Wednesday 20th June 2012, the first day of the UN Earth Summit in Rio. It's an invitation to explore how overcoming big challenges can lead to better lives for us all.

The festival includes Transition Walks, in association the Ramblers Association, which explore how great change happened in the past, is already happening and can happen. Additionally, museums, galleries and other public spaces will host events asking the question "what if?". Finally, on 20th June 2012, participants are invited to conduct their own real life experiment in living differently, in showing what's possible. Participants are encouraged to share photos, videos and stories, which will be broadcast directly in Rio and archived online to provide a lasting source of inspiration for public and policymakers alike.

Kenneth E. Boulding Award

The International Society of Ecological Economics has awarded William Rees, Ph.D., FRSC and Mathis Wackernagel, as co-recipients of the 2012 Boulding Memorial Award. The award is given in honor or Kenneth E. Boulding (1910-1993) who was a leading systems thinker who integrated social theory with the natural sciences and moral philosophy. He was an eccentric, provocative critic of the fragmentation that characterized modern scholarship. Yet his creativity, seminal ideas, and constructive engagement with the scientific community were widely recognized, resulting in his being elected President of the American Economics Association and of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

Building on Rees' earlier work on human carrying capacity, Wiliam Rees and Mathis Wackernagel developed Ecological Footprint accounting (EFA) in the early 1990s. The 'Eco-footprint' has since become the world's premier measure of humanity's demand on nature. EFA estimates the physical area of land and water ecosystems any specified human population requires to produce the bio-resources it consumes and to absorb its carbon waste, using prevailing technology. Eco-footprinting shows unambiguously that the human enterprise is in 'overshoot', currently demanding up to 50% more of nature's annual production and assimilative capacity than is available--the world community is living unsustainably by depleting essential 'natural capital'.
