SCORAI Participates in Delft Conference

The European Roundtable on Sustainable Consumption and Production (ERSCP) and the organization Environmental Management for Sustainable Universities (EMSU) held a joint conference in Delft, The Netherlands, on October 25-28 (<http://www.erscp-emsu2010.org>). SCORAI had originally planned to present five or six papers at this large event, but in the end participated in a session with Irmgard Schultz (Institute Social Ecological Research in Frankfurt, Germany). Approximately one hour was devoted to a detailed discussion of SCORAI and its aims before a nicely sized audience.

Philip sketched out the history, mission, and main activities of the network. He also discussed the first SCORAI workshop held at Clark University in October 2009 and the main follow-ups and major issues being addressed within the network. From the reactions of the participants it was clear that SCORAI already has high public visibility in Europe and is much appreciated within the community. finding publications and professional contacts. Feedback also indicated that SCORAI is filling an important institutional need since completion of the European Union-funded SCORE! project. The effort to link consumption and the "new economics," socio-technical transitions, and theories of practice was regarded as a timely and useful initiative. Some session participants suggested that SCORAI should embark on a more conscious outreach effort to globalize its activities. The network's Executive Committee will take up this discussion in coming weeks. An alternative model would be to improve connections with other existing or emerging networks.

In the mean time, we welcome the participation of new European members and look forward to a considerable European presence at the SCORAI workshop scheduled for April 2011. Information about this event will be disseminated via the SCORAI website over the next few weeks.

UN DESA Confirms Dates

Confirmed dates for the intersessional on sustainable consumption and production. Thanks to Minister Arias, Panama's Minister of the Environment and CSD19 Bureau Co-chair, UNDESA-DSD is pleased to announce the venue and date of the Commission on Sustainable Development Intersessional on SCP to be held 13-14 January, 2011, in Panama City, Panama. The Intersessional will provide a non-negotiating space for Member States, Major Groups, and United Nations agencies to discuss potential programs to be included in the 10-Year Framework of Programs on SCP (10YFP) to support regional and national initiatives, the structure the 10YFP could take, and the possible visions and objectives it could serve.

Global Outlook on Sustainable Consumption and Production (SCP) Policies

The United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) is developing a Global Outlook on Sustainable Consumption and Production (SCP) Policies. Towards this end, UNEP is conducting a global survey on SCP among governments, business, and civil society organizations. As a key player in the transition to sustainable consumption and production patterns, UNEP believes that you could make a valuable contribution to this project. UNEP also believes that this will be a good opportunity to ensure visibility and recognition of the valuable contribution your institution is making. The results of the survey will be presented at the 19th session of the UN Commission on Sustainable Development in May 2011. The Global Outlook report and database will hence become a reference for SCP policies and practices along the whole life cycle of goods and services, wherever possible

also recording development benefits.
