# Nearing Final Countdown for SCORAI Conference at Clark University!

It is now less than 75 days until the SCORAl Conference at Clark University in Worcester, Massachusetts on June 12-14. Under the theme "The Future of Consumerism and Well-Being in a World of Ecological Constraints," the event will include more than 100 presentations by scholars working in the field of sustainable consumption, several policy briefings by national and international experts, and a concluding plenary dialogue. 

### **Publications of Interest**



Edited by Frances Fahy & Henrike Rau and published by SAGE (London) this March is a systematic and critical review of the key research methods used when studying sustainable strategies and outcomes at local, regional and national level. Written by Irish and European contributors from across the social sciences, it is complete with case study material and practical advice for academic and non-academic audiences interested in sustainability research.

<u>Time Culture</u> is a <u>new publication</u> which explores how a temporal perspective can help conceptualise/operationalise

questions around sustainability. The author, Jeppe Graugaard from the School of Environmental Sciences at the University of East Anglia also published <u>an intriguing post</u> on this publication on the Science, Society and Sustainability (3S) research group's blog.

"Equity within Limits. Theory and Practice" an e-book and accompanying Background Paper have recently been published. These publications were completed as part of an FP7 research project (CONVERGE). The authors sought out inspirational examples of initiatives from all fields of life - including policy, business, research and community initiatives, in different parts of the world that address the imperatives of both living within the limits of the planet (contraction) and sharing its resources equitably (convergence). The e-book provides a summary of the research with information on the methodology used, introduces the 28 case studies (initiatives) studied in detail and presents their analysis and evaluation.

A new blog post by SCORAl'er Ruben Anderson looks at the means of cultivating behavior change in his new post "Compassionate Systems" and slidecast on the same subject.

# **Sustainable Mobility for European Cities: Experts Sketch the Future**

The most recent RESPONDER brokerage event was recently held in Vienna convened experts from 16 European countries to discuss the trends, barriers and approaches for sustainable mobility in European cities. Experts agreed that it is necessary to focus on clever combinations of technological and infrastructural solutions with measure to stimulate changes on the demand side. In a nutshell, sustainable urban mobility in the future has to opt for clean technologies, smart infrastructure to favor the change of modal split towards more walking, cycling, and public transport. # Structural Prerequisites for Sustainable Societies?

An international workshop on "Structural Prerequisites for Sustainable Societies and the Good Life - Taking the Sustainable Consumption Lens Seriously" took place at the University of Muenster on March 21-22, 2013. The workshop inquired into the possibilities and conditions of a common vision of the good life, the structural changes needed to allow the societal development and pursuit of such a vision, and the most promising political intervention points on behalf of a societal transformation towards sustainable consumption and the good life. Debate centered on the relevance of power in sustainable consumption research and governance and the potential and limits for a diffusion and mainstreaming of local or regional sustainability initiatives. # Challenging Consumption: Pathways to a More Sustainable Future - proceedings from the CONSENSUS International Conference 2012

The **CONSENSUS International Conference** took place at the National University of Ireland, Galway on the 18-20th of May. 2012. **CONSENSUS** (consumption, environment and sustainability) is a four-year, collaborative, Irish research project led by Trinity College Dublin in partnership with the NUIG and funded by the Environmental Protection Agency. This conference, provided an international forum for the exchange of pioneering research in the field of sustainable consumption and enabled the exploration of future research collaborations between prominent researchers and networks. A series of presentations and panel discussions at the conference provided a landscape of the breadth and scope of research currently being undertaken in the field of sustainable consumption. A document has recently been drafted that summarises the principal conference proceedings and discussion points. In particular, this document focuses on the practices, challenges and futures of sustainable consumption and related research across disciplines and international frameworks. It will be of interest to those involved in policy, research and business relating to matters of sustainable consumption. All other outputs from the CONSENSUS project can also be found **here**.
